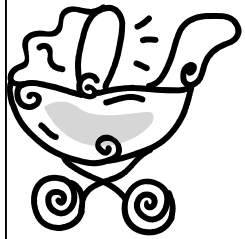

49. Q. What is the second commandment?

A. The second commandment is, "You shall not make for yourself any carved image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth: You shall not bow down to them or serve them: because I the LORD your God am a jealous God, causing the consequences of the sin of the fathers to fall on the children to the third and fourth generation of those who hate me; and showing mercy to thousands of those who love me, and keep My commandments.

50. Q. What is required in the second commandment?

A. The second commandment requires the receiving, observing, and keeping pure and complete of all the worship and commandments that God has given us in His Word.

51. Q. What is forbidden in the second commandment?

A. The second commandment forbids us to worship God through images, or any other way not commanded in His Word.
