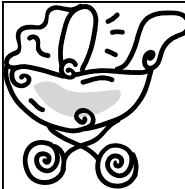

Next Sunday we are planning to celebrate the Lord's Supper during our Worship Service. As we remember our Savior's Death and celebrating His Resurrection, we recall that Christ came to give His life as payment for the sins of His people. We are invited to partake in the feast of the Bread and the Wine, not because we are perfect or without sin, in fact just the opposite. Because we are sinful in our daily lives, the grace of God is abundant for us. Our sins are paid for, and we are called to live in a way that reflects the mercy we have been shown. Participation in the Lord's Supper is a renewal of our commitment to life as a Christian.

We must understand that the bread and cup are a sign and a seal of the true reality in the body and blood of Christ. But then we must realize that living as a Christian has relationship obligations. We must ask God to show us sins that we harbor in our hearts toward others or toward Him. And then confess these sins to God *and* to those we have hurt by our attitudes and actions, so that we may live as a unified body of Christ on earth.

The challenge of the life of a Disciple is to remember the Grace and Mercy of our Savior, which He has freely given to us. Prepare your hearts and minds this week, as a believer in the finished work of Christ, to receive the blessing of this Grace as we gather around His table next week.

Question 49: Which is the second commandment?

Answer: The second commandment is, Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth: Thou shalt not bow down thyself to them, nor serve them: for I the Lord thy God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children unto the third and fourth generation of them that hate me; and showing mercy unto thousands of them that love me, and keep my commandments.1

1Exod. 20:4, 5, 6.

Question 50: What is required in the second commandment?

Answer: The second commandment requires the receiving, observing, and keeping pure and entire, all such religious worship and ordinances as God has appointed in His word.1

1Deut. 32:46; Matt. 28:20; Acts 2:42

Question 51: What is forbidden in the second commandment?

A. The second commandment forbids the worshipping of God by images,1 or any other way not appointed in his word.2

Question 52: What are the reasons annexed to the second commandment?

Answer: The reasons annexed to the second commandment are, God's sovereignty over us,1 his propriety in us,2 and the zeal he has for His own worship.3
