## Is Anybody Out There?

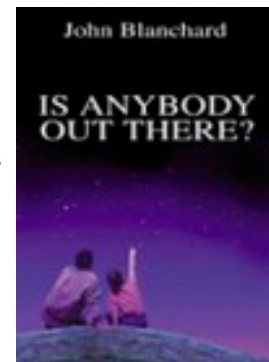

John Blanchard has, in this short 37 page booklet, masterfully provided us with a very useful apologetics tool to give away. Apologetics refers to giving a defense, a reasoned explanation for what and why we believe as we do. Peter tells us to always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have.

Blanchard moves seamlessly from topic to topic, covering the various questions or objections that a not-yet-Christian might have toward Christianity. He begins with "The search" for somebody out there; moves to "The faith factor" of the interconnections between faith and reason, and explores "The blind alley" of agnosticism, "The desert" of atheism, and "The vacuum" of various world religions. Next he explains why "The truth" of the Bible should be considered, and how

God's sovereignty is necessary. And this is just the first half of the booklet! The booklet follows with other short provocative topics such as "The assassin," "The fingerprint," "The pretender," "The attack," "The plague," "The exception," "The mediator," "The hinge," "The needs, and "The way in."

Since Blanchard writes in a winsome and convincing style and offers copious quotes from many sources, I would heartily recommend Christians purchase this book (I was able to buy a copy on half.com for \$2.05), read it, and prayerfully share it with family and friends. And then, since it contains many great conversation starters, plan to get together and talk with those with whom you have shared this book.

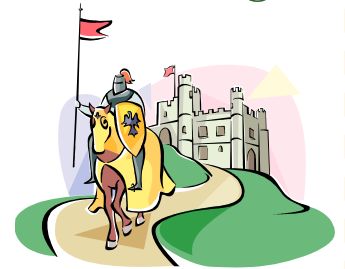
Do you hear the trumpets? Do you see the lords and ladies entering the court? Can you see the court jester? The King is coming! Make way for the King!

# October Family Meeting Recap

On September 13, the New Harmony congregation had an informational meeting. It was opened with prayer by Clif Asselmeier. A recap of the calendar year showed that to date we have averaged 33 people in our worship service each week, with a peak of 43 in April. We have had 20 non-Concord visitors so far this year, and several of them have worshiped with us several times, three of them consistently. Financially, for the 2008-2009 fiscal year, New Harmony expenses were \$71,945.25, (about \$2,000 below budget) and our giving was \$54,707.54.

New Harmony has had ongoing conversations about our current worship location. We have been grateful to the YMCA and thankful to the Lord for providing a flexible and affordable location, but being outside of Columbia has proven to be a bigger obstacle than originally understood. There are several free standing buildings which would provide great location and ministry opportunities, but the cost is pro-

hibitive. The Steering Committee is evaluating a possibility to jointly lease space with another venture in Columbia. There are two location possibilities that are under evaluation, but nothing has been proposed to the Session at this point. One of the priorities in making any move is to remain within the current budget limits; if there were any additional costs, they would need to be covered outside the budget.

Ron Schewe reported that the Evaluation Committee was nearing the end of their work. The report would be given to the Steering Committee to then be presented to the Session with recommendations. Carole Harres and William Nobbe, members of the committee, expressed appreciation to all those who met and shared their thoughts and observations.

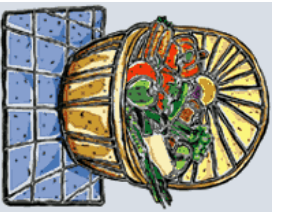
There was a time of questions and answers, and then the meeting was closed in prayer by Jim Meppiel.

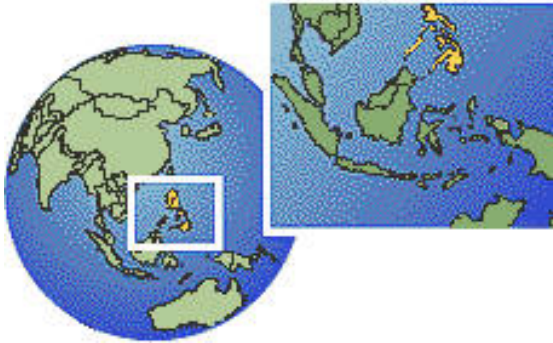

## Our Missionaries in the Philippines: Reneirio & Lani Quimbo



Rene and Lani are natives of the Philippines, and both came to faith in the Lord Jesus Christ through Campus Crusade for Christ and Navigator's ministries, respectively. Rene holds a bachelor's degree in Agricultural Business and a master's degree in Business Administration. Lani has a bachelor's degree in Agriculture and a master's degree in Animal Science. They met while working at PCARRD's Technology Packaging for Countryside Development office, got married in 1986, and have two sons. Both led Bible studies in their neighborhood for years, and Rene was a member of the Los Banos Christian Reformed Church's outreach committee.

In 1990, the family responded to God's call to serve as teachers in a mission school run by the Palau Evangelical Church and Liebenzell Missions in the Republic of Palau in the west Caroline Islands. In 1995, a town in western Mindanao (Philippines) was devastated by Muslim rebels, and they responded again to God's call for them to serve the Lord among the Muslims in Mindanao.

After completing their missionary work in Palau in 1996, they entered Covenant Theological Seminary in St. Louis, to pursue seminary education. In May 2000, Rene completed his Master of Divinity degree, while Lani completed her Master of Arts in General Theological Studies. They returned to the Philippines and started the Portal Study Center, a ministry to young professionals, high school and college students (both Muslims and non-Muslims) in Cagayan de Oro City in Min-

danao. Rene and Lani are working under the umbrella of the Presbyterian Mission International based at Covenant Theological Seminary.

Since 2001, they have been involved in many ministries, including: Bible studies, day care, adult literacy classes, health clinics, men's and women's fellowships, and many more. They have been ministering through the House of Hope Ministry Center, the Hillside Learning Center, the Zamboanga City Ministry Center (in a Muslim village) where Rene and Lani are the only non-Muslims who reside in the area.

Their son Iking serves as a volunteer nurse at the city hospital since paid nursing positions are usually tied to local politicians. Rory, the younger son, is currently in college pursuing a degree in Information Technology. Both Iking and Rory help in the various ministries as their schedule allows.

The Quimbos covet your prayers, and they remain grateful to you for your unwavering partnership through the years. May God find us all faithful in every thing He has entrusted to us until He comes again.

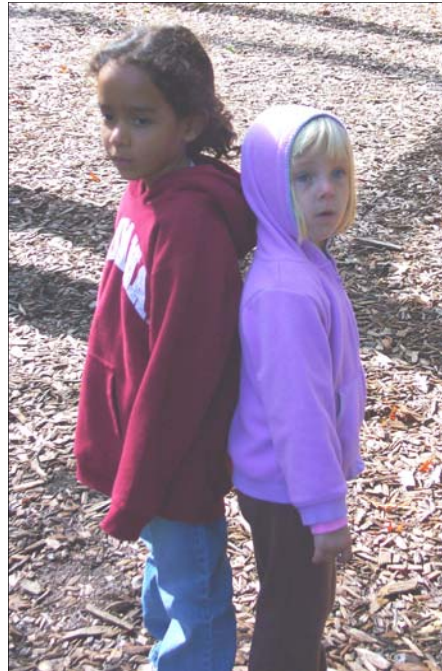




# Scenes from the Fall Family Retreat October 9 - 11

# What is 'success' in Parenting Teens?

**What sort of goals should a parent have as their children reach the teenage years?** Unfortunately, western culture has had a terribly cynical view of the teen years. It's a view that is largely biologically based. People tend to see teenagers as a collection of raging, rebel hormones encased in skin. Of course, the idea is that you can't talk to a hormone. I read someone who put it very well. He said that if you add the word "teenage" to any other word, it becomes a negative. Take "teenage driver." That's a simple instance of how this particular age group attracts cynicism.

The problem with this way of looking at teens is that it's a subtle denial of the Gospel. That's a devastating theology. My experience is that when parents buy into that view of the Gospel for their teenagers, it begins to bleed over into other relationships. They begin to have doubts about whether Christ can reach all sorts of people.

That means that simply surviving your teens is not enough of a goal. In a sense, having survival as a goal is selfish because it's focused simply on getting yourself through a difficult time. The other problem with having survival as a goal is that, as parents, we tend to settle for external, behaviorist sorts of goals.

Naturally, all parents need to have regulations that control the behavior of their children, but it's not enough of a goal. The sort of rule-keeping that we describe as behaviorism, which is disconnected from the heart, is repudiated throughout the Bible and was the peculiar sin of the Pharisees. Christ roundly condemned it. And yet Christian parents can be very successful at creating a new generation of young Pharisees who live with no sense of need for the Gospel at all, because they're quite good at keeping external rules. That's pretty scary to me.

We need to see that the final years of a child's life at home are a time of unprecedented opportunity. As a child's world unfolds before him and he experiences greater freedom, his heart gets revealed. This means that we have to take every

opportunity to be part of the final stage of preparation. Being involved with our teenagers at a deep level is something we mustn't avoid.

**What's the real problem that teenagers face? Is it their hormones or is it their hearts?** The world says it's their hormones; but the Bible says, in literally hundreds of ways, that human beings live out of their hearts. We like to think that it's other people and circumstances that cause us to do what we do. However, this little bit of blame-shifting comes straight out of the garden of Eden. The Bible says that our situations and relationships are merely the occasions in which our hearts express themselves. I really live out of my heart. The heart is the directional system for each one of us.

**What do you mean when you use the word 'heart?'**

The Bible has a very simple anthropology. It says that people consist of two parts: the outer man—which is your earth suit, and the inner man—which is your spiritual self. The Bible uses a number of words—mind, emotion, will, spirit—to describe the heart. In a sense, "the heart" is one, big basket term; it's really biblical shorthand for the inner man and all its functions.

The Bible attributes many important functions to the heart. It tells us that we feel, think, purpose, desire, believe with our hearts. We also receive or reject God's new covenant with them, too. This means that if the heart is the steering wheel of the human being, if it's the thing that causes us to do what we do, then it's quite obvious that the focus of parenting has to be the heart.

Christ, as you know, uses the example of the tree to explain the function of the heart. You look at the tree and its fruit and you say: "That's an apple tree, because it has apples." Now we know that the reason it has apples is because it is apple-istic right down to its roots. If it wasn't an apple tree by nature, it wouldn't produce apples. In Christ's example, the tree equals the heart, and the fruit equals behavior and its consequences.

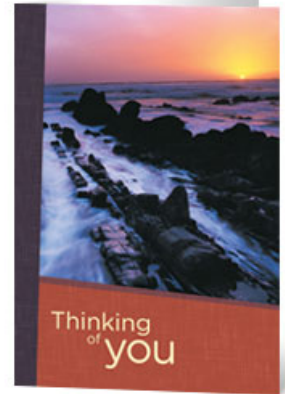
